June 2022 Observatory Report. From the 1stJune to the 30thJune.

Avocet: Only seen on five days during June.

Bearded Reedlings: First seen on the 15thJune when 7 were present. Have been seen on seven occasions this month.

Black Headed Gull: Present every day. Highest number was 66 on the 27thJuneBlack Tailed Godwit: Present most days apart from the 16th to the 26thJune.

Cetti's Warbler: Heard nearly every day. Two heard on the 2nd and 17thJune.

Chiffchaff: Heard on seven occasions but only seen once and that was on the 9thJune.

Common Tern: Seen most days, usually at the far end of the Pans near the tern raft but can be seen from the observatory gate fishing in the harbour. 5 birds were present on the 30thJune.

Coot: Seen every day during the month. One pair have three young.

Cuckoo: Heard on 9 occasions but only seen twice.

Garganey: A new species for the site. A pair were present on the 13thJune.

Goldfinch: Recorded 12 times during the month. 10 recorded on the 23rdJune.

Greenfinch: Present every day. Juveniles were seen towards the end of the month. 7 has been the highest number recorded on the 27thJune.

Greenshank: One or two present until the 16th June. Since then it is usual to see four Greenshank each day.

Grey Heron: Seen every day. Three present on the 11th 12th and 17th June.

Jay: Common to see them flying over the Pans. Four recorded on the 19th and 23rdJune.

Kingfisher: Two Kingfishers have been using the Kingfisher pool during June. A juvenile male and a juvenile female. Neither of them are ringed. Seen on 22 days during June.

Lapwing: Present nearly every day during the month. 44 on the 17thJune.

Little Grebe: Present most days. 9 were present on the 29thJune.

Little tern: Have been seen fishing at the far end of the Pans on 15 occasions. Three were present on the 4thJune.

Long Tailed Tit: Recorded on 10 occasions during the month. 20 were seen flying one after the other along the hedge by the gate on the 18thJune.

Mallard: The Mallards seem to have bred very well this year. Several broods and second broods have been seen on Avon Water and the Pans. Mallards have been present every day with the highest number being 87 on the 30thJune.

Marsh Harrier: Have been seen on 16 occasions this month but only a single bird.

Mute Swan: Present every day The pair started with 5 cygnets and are now down to 3.

Oystercatcher: Present most days. 8 has been the highest number, on 28thJune.

Reed Bunting: A single male has been seen on 10 occasions but only on the Avon Water side.

Reed Warbler: Present every day. 2 juveniles were seen on the 29thJune.

Sand Martin: Present on 16 occasions.

Shelduck: Present nearly every day. 12 was the highest number recorded on the 17thJune. One pair have 9 chicks, first seen on the 17thJune.

Swallow: Seen every day.

Swift: Recorded on 13 days during the month.

Birds recorded but not mentioned in this report.

Blackbird, Bullfinch. Buzzard, Canada goose, Carrion Crow, Chaffinch, Collared Dove, Cormorant, Dunnock, Gadwall, Goldfinch, Great Black Backed gull, Great Tit, Herring Gull, House Sparrow, Jackdaw, Kestrel, Lesser Black Backed Gull. Little Egret, Mediterranean Gull, Moorhen, Pheasant, Pied wagtail, Redshank, Red Kite, Ringed Plover, Robin, Sparrowhawk, Starling, Stock Dove, Tufted Duck, Water Rail, Woodpigeon and Wren.
