Mute Swan. Little Egret. Mallard. Moorhen. Grey Heron.

The water levels varied considerably, going from, very high to almost normal.




Photo showing quite a large wave flowing through the Kingfisher pool.

This time, some damage was caused and the fire extinguisher taken.

This intruder was unable to enter through the windows as he had previously done, so he targeted the door from the deck and forced the locks. As you can see, this photo was taken on the 17<sup>th</sup> January which means that once the locks had been broken he or they could have entered the Observatory at any time.

I have set up another trail cam on the left-hand side of the deck as you approach the Observatory. So hopefully whoever walks along the deck will be photographed by this camera.

I have already spoken to David (H) and Keith about the break in and they have both said that the security of the Observatory should be discussed by the committee.
